

“My Pet has Fleas!! Now what?!?!”

STEP ONE: Get your pet, and EVERY PET IN THE HOUSEHOLD treated for fleas!

- Treating only one pet in the household, will NOT get rid of the flea problem
- We recommend treating every pet in the house with an appropriate flea product (Advantage, Advantage Multi, Revolution), for AT LEAST THREE MONTHS
- In severe flea infestations, some pets may even have tapeworm, which also needs to be treated.

STEP TWO: Clean all of your pets bedding, blankets, beds, stuffed animals etc. in a HOT wash cycle, frequently

STEP THREE: Vacuum all floors and carpets in the house, focusing on baseboards and in between floor boards, and underneath furniture

- When finished vacuuming, empty the vacuum cleaner OUTSIDE to avoid recontamination

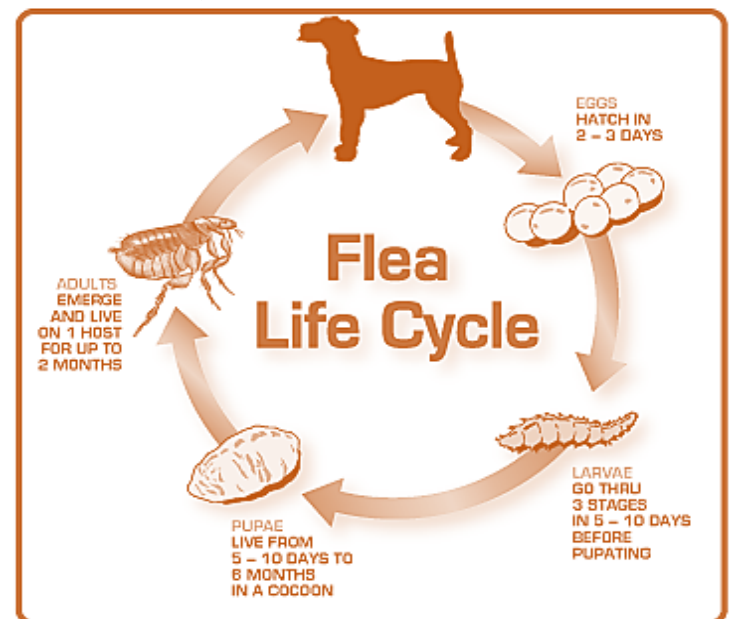
AVOID THE USE OF FLEA SPRAYS, ESPECIALLY IN HOUSEHOLDS WITH CATS. THESE SPRAYS CAN BE TOXIC TO YOUR CHILDREN AND PETS, ESPECIALLY CATS.

How did your pet get fleas you ask??

- Your dog can pick up fleas from another dog, or even just out on a walk (fleas like to hide in dark, damp places outside)
- You can bring fleas into the house on your clothing, shopping bags etc.
- If your cat is a hunter, he/she can get fleas (tapeworm)

AND.....YES, YOUR PET CAN GET FLEAS IN THE WINTER!

- Fleas can overwinter inside
- You can bring them in on your clothing
- Pets can get them from hunting or contact with other infested animals
